INSTRUCTIONS

This activity is best played with a partner.

1. Pick one person to be the Scribe and one person to be the Storyteller.
2. The Scribe asks the Storyteller to fill in the blanks within the mad lib. This means that the Scribe asks the Storyteller to pick a word for each word category (noun, verb, adjective) until all the fill-in-the-blanks are filled.
3. The Storyteller then reads aloud the mad lib that the two people have created together!
