Core Capacity Transit Study The Bay Area Core Capacity Transit Study (CCTS) is a collaborative effort led by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) in partnership with SFMTA, SFCTA, BART, AC Transit, WETA, and Caltrain. Plan Bay Area 2040 A state-mandated, integrated long-range transportation, land-use and housing plan that will support a growing economy, provide more housing and transportation choices and reduce transportation-related pollution in the nine-county San Francisco Bay Area. Plan Bay Area 2040 is the strategic update to Plan Bay Area 2013. On July 18, 2013, the Plan 2013 was jointly approved by the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) Executive Board and by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC).
