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The Port of San Francisco (the "Port") announces an Invitation for Bids ("IFB") for construction on HERON'S HEAD SHORELINE RESILIENCE in San Francisco, CA. The scope of work is to 1) construct temporary construction access roads to the marsh area, 2) construction a new stabilized shoreline by placing coarse sand and gravel stabilized by rock and cobble groynes, 3) install reclaimed-wood habitat structures for wildlife (Additive Bid Alternate), 4) Install Oyster Reef Balls (Additive Bid Alternates) and 5) restore the site to previous conditions along the access routes, including but not limited to: repaving, removal of temporary fill, and replanting. Time is of the essence (TOE) for the completion of the earthwork and fill placement in the intertidal zone, work listed under Bid Items 6 through 10 of the Bid Schedule. The Port stands to lose funding if the Work is not on time. Assuming the CITY issues the Notice to Proceed on July 15, 2022, the

deadline for **Substantial Completion is no later than December 31, 2022**. Bidder should refer to Section 00 73 02 for details.

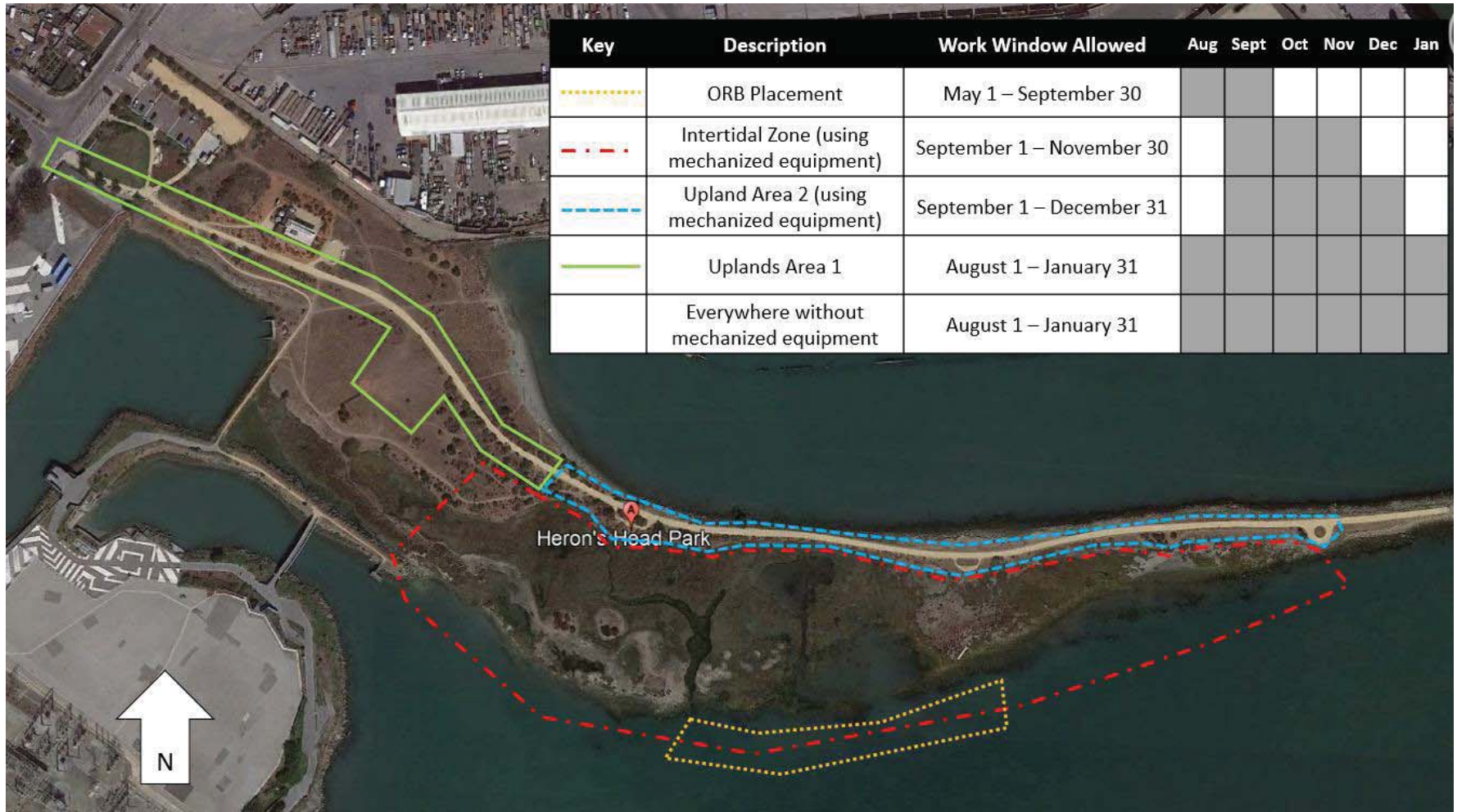

This notice is for information only. Please refer to the bid documents for specific requirements.

Insurance Requirements: Please refer to Section 00 73 16, and submit requisite insurance documentation within ten (10) working days after the date on which the contract is awarded.

Schedule: Contractor shall be responsible for fully understanding scheduling constraints associated with certain marine construction activities and the referenced Port approvals and permits from applicable government agencies, including the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration - National Marine Fisheries Service, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service special status species. **See figure below. Work may occur August 1 through January 31 in Upland Area 1. Work requiring mechanized construction equipment in Upland Area 2 may occur during September 1 through December 31. Work in the Intertidal zone using mechanized construction equipment may occur during September 1 through November 30. Work using manual labor anywhere may be done any time through January 31.** Contractor shall comply with all construction regulations and construction mitigation requirements resulting from these specific nesting and spawning seasons. Coordination is considered incidental, and no additional compensation will be paid for this coordination.

Prime Contractor Qualifications:

1. Valid contractor's license for Class "A" issued by the California Contractor's State Licensing Board with at least ten (10) years of experience working on related projects,
2. Contractor shall have documented experience in performing a minimum of three (3) similar construction projects with similar work as shown in the Contract Documents over the last 5 years,
3. Contractor shall have documented experience with a minimum three (3) public works projects over the last 5 years, and
4. Safety History. The definition of the term Responsible (Responsibility) in Section 6.1 of the San Francisco Administrative Code provides that a bidder or proposer for a construction contract must "substantiate[s] its record of safe performance on construction projects, including but not limited to consideration of federal or state Occupational Safety and Health Administration ("OSHA") violations and work place fatalities, including OSHA citations under appeal, in accordance with regulations issued by the City Administrator," in order for the City to find the entity to be Responsible and eligible for contract award. Accordingly, Bidders are required to pass the Port's Safety Qualification procedures in order to be eligible for contract award. Refer to Section 00 49 00-APPA-1 for the **Safety Qualification Form**. Refer to Section 00 49 00 (SUPPLEMENTARY BIDDING FORMS CHECKLIST) for the submittal deadline. Bid security in the form of a corporate surety bond or an irrevocable letter of credit (or certified check if required bid security is \$15,000 or less) for ten percent (10%) of the amount bid must accompany each bid. For information on the City's Surety Bond Program, call Nancy Owens at (415) 217-6578.

Contractor Vaccination Policy: A Contractor awarded a Contract pursuant to this Solicitation must agree to comply with the requirements of the 38th Supplement to Mayoral Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency ("Emergency Declaration"), dated February 25, 2020, and the Contractor Vaccination Policy for City Contractors issued by the City Administrator ("Contractor Vaccination Policy"), as those documents may be amended from time to time. A Contract subject to the Emergency Declaration is an agreement between the City and any other entity or individual and any subcontract under such agreement, where Covered Employees of the Contractor or Subcontractor work in-person with City employees in connection with the work or services performed under the agreement at a City owned, leased, or controlled facility. Such agreements include, but are not limited to, professional services contracts, general services contracts, public works contracts, and grants. Contract includes such agreements currently in place or entered into during the term of the Emergency Declaration. Contract does not include an agreement with a state or federal governmental entity or agreements that do not involve the City paying or receiving funds.

In accordance with the Emergency Declaration, Contractor agrees that:

- (1) Contractor has read the Contractor Vaccination Policy pertaining to the obligations of City;
- (2) Where applicable, Contractor shall ensure it complies with the requirements of the [Contractor Vaccination Policy](#) pertaining to Covered Employees, as they are defined under the Emergency Declaration and the Contractor Vaccination Policy, and insure such Covered Employees are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 or obtain an exemption based on medical or religious grounds,

(3) If Contractor grants Covered Employees an exemption based on medical or religious grounds, Contractor will promptly notify City by completing and submitting the Covered Employees Granted Exemptions Form (“Exemptions Form”), which can be found at <https://sf.gov/confirm-vaccine-status-your-employees-and-subcontractors> (navigate to “Exemptions” to download the form).

If a Contractor is unable to comply with this Policy, it will be deemed non responsive unless City is able to secure a waiver on Contractor’s behalf. *Refer to Attachment 1, City’s Proposed Agreement Terms for additional details related to the application of this Policy to a contract awarded pursuant to this Solicitation.*

In accordance with San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6, no bid is accepted and no contract in excess of \$706,000 is awarded by the City and County of San Francisco until such time as (a) the Port Commission approves the contract for award and (b) the Port Executive Director or designee then issues an order of award. Pursuant to Charter Section 3.105, all contract awards are subject to certification by the Controller as to the availability of funds.

In accordance with San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6, Sec. 6.4, Contractor shall use to the maximum extent possible, **recycled content materials**, rather than virgin materials.

All contractors and subcontractors who bid or work on a public works project must register and pay an annual fee to the California Department of Industrial Relations (“DIR”). No contractor or subcontractor may be listed in a bid for a public works project unless registered with the DIR as required by Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)]. No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work on a public works project unless registered with the DIR pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5.

This Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement of prevailing wage requirements by the California Department of Industrial Relations and/or the San Francisco Office of Labor Standards Enforcement.

Minimum wage rates for this project must comply with the current General Prevailing Wage as determined by the State Department of Industrial Relations. Minimum wage rates other than applicable to General Prevailing Wage must comply with San Francisco Administrative Code, Chapter 12P, Minimum Compensation Ordinance.

This contract utilizes federal funding, which requires that the current David-Bacon wage rates for the applicable trades for this project need to be updated as of 10 days prior to the bid date. At the time of the bid the David-Bacon wage rates in place shall remain throughout the contract. If the State of California prevailing minimum wages are higher than the David-Bacon wage rates then the higher of the two shall be used. See Section 00 52 00-5.05 and Section 00 73 73 APPA for additional details.

Bidders are hereby advised that the Contractor to whom the Contract is awarded must be certified by the Contract Monitoring Division as being in compliance with the Equal Benefits Provisions of Chapter 12B of the Administrative Code within two weeks after notification of Award.

Pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code (SFAC) Section 6.25, “Clean Construction is required for the performance of all work unless a waiver of all or part of the requirements of that Chapter has been granted under Sections 25.5 or 25.7.”

The Port seeks to promote diversity within its contracting opportunities. We desire to engage contracting teams that reflect the diversity of our City and include participation of both businesses and residents from the City’s most disadvantaged communities including, but not limited to, the neighborhoods in the 94107, 94124, and 94134 zip codes. As such, the City recommends that bidders consider the composition of their teams in terms of gender, age, ethnicity, and race, and to utilize teams that include a diverse mix of staff at all organizational levels.

The Port reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive any minor irregularities in any bid.
