The work will consist of on-call dredging at the Port of San Francisco, which includes mobilization and demobilization, hydrographic surveying, dredging, dredge material transportation for in-Bay disposal, ocean disposal to beneficial reuse sites, and crane lifting services, all as set forth in the construction contract documents.

Although there is no LBE subcontracting requirement for this project, Bidders are highly encouraged to add Small-, Micro-, and SBA-LBE subcontractors to their team. The successful Bidder will inform CMD and the Port of all subcontracting opportunities available before each dredging event during the course of the contract. The successful Bidder is encouraged to work with CMD to identify Micro-, Small-, and SBA-LBE firms available to perform subcontracting tasks, and will prioritize awarding available subcontracting work to LBEs to the extent possible. Furthermore, CMD forms will need to be submitted as required with the proposal and for contract monitoring.

If necessary, the Port will issue bid date changes by addendum and will post current date for receiving bids on the Bids and Contracts page at the Port's website address: https://sfport.com/construction-opportunities.

This notice is for information only. Please refer to the bid documents for specific requirements.

Insurance Requirements: Please refer to Section 00 73 16, and submit requisite insurance documentation within ten (10) working days after the date on which the contract is awarded.

Schedule: Contractor shall be responsible for fully understanding scheduling constraints associated with certain marine construction activities and the referenced Port approvals and permits from applicable government agencies, including the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration - National Marine Fisheries Service, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service special status species. The Pacific herring spawning or hatching season extends from December 1 – February 28; salmon and steelhead trout seasons extends from December 1 to June 1. Contractor shall comply with all construction regulations and construction mitigation requirements resulting from these specific spawning seasons. Coordination is considered incidental, and no compensation shall be paid for this coordination.



Contractor Qualifications:

- 1. Valid Class A contractor's license, issued by the California Contractor's State Licensing Board.
- 2. Contractor shall submit documented experience performing a minimum of three (3) projects with similar work as shown in the Contract Documents over the last 10 years,
- Contractor shall submit documented experience with a minimum three (3) public works projects over the last 10 years. Contractor shall submit documentation showing ability to dredge, transport, and dispose at least 5,000 cubic yards sediment on a daily basis.
- 4. Contractor shall submit subcontractor qualifications of an independent certified hydrographer surveyor (national certification American Congress of Surveying and Mapping (ACSM) –The Hydrographic Society of America (THSOA) Hydrographer Certification. Contractor shall submit surveyor documentation (whether on the Contractor's staff or a subcontractor) for a minimum of three (3) years experience in performing hydrographic survey for sites similar to the Contract Documents.
- 5. Safety History: Submit sufficient information on the Bidder's Safety Record form (Section 00 45 14), and additional sheets as necessary, to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the City that Prime Contractor substantiates its record of safe performance on construction projects.

Bid security in the form of a corporate surety bond or an irrevocable letter of credit (or certified check if required bid security is \$15,000 or less) for ten percent (10%) of the amount bid must accompany each bid. For information on the City's Surety Bond Program, call Nancy Owens at (415) 217-6578.

In accordance with San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6, no bid is accepted and no contract in excess of \$1,000,000 is awarded by the City and County of San Francisco until such time as (a) the Port Commission approves the contract for award and (b) the Port Executive Director or designee then issues an order of award. Pursuant to Charter Section 3.105, all contract awards are subject to certification by the Controller as to the availability of funds.

Contractor Vaccination Policy: A Contractor awarded a Contract pursuant to this Solicitation must agree to comply with the requirements of the 38th Supplement to Mayoral Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency ("Emergency Declaration"), dated February 25, 2020, and the Contractor Vaccination Policy for City Contractors issued by the City Administrator ("Contractor Vaccination Policy"), as those documents may be amended from time to time. A copy of the Contractor Vaccination Policy can be found here: https://sf.gov/confirm-vaccine-status-your-employees-and-subcontractors.

A Contract subject to the Emergency Declaration is an agreement between the City and any other entity or individual and any subcontract under such agreement, where Covered Employees of the Contractor or Subcontractor work in-person with City employees in connection with the work or services performed under the agreement at a City owned, leased, or controlled facility. Such agreements include, but are not limited to, professional services contracts, general services contracts, public works contracts, and grants. Contract includes such agreements currently in place or entered into during the term of the Emergency Declaration. Contract does not include an agreement with a state or federal governmental entity or agreements that do not involve the City paying or receiving funds.

In accordance with the Emergency Declaration, Contractor agrees that:

- (1) Contractor has read the Contractor Vaccination Policy pertaining to the obligations of City;
- (2) Where applicable, Contractor shall ensure it complies with the requirements of the <u>Contractor Vaccination Policy (https://sf.gov/confirm-vaccine-status-your-employees-and-subcontractors)</u> pertaining to Covered Employees, as they are defined under the Emergency Declaration and the Contractor Vaccination Policy, and insure such Covered Employees are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 or obtain an exemption based on medical or religious grounds.
- (3) If Contractor grants Covered Employees an exemption based on medical or religious grounds, Contractor will promptly notify City by completing and submitting the Covered Employees Granted Exemptions Form ("Exemptions Form"), which can be found at https://sf.gov/confirm-vaccine-status-your-employees-and-subcontractors (navigate to "Exemptions" to download the form).

If a Contractor is unable to comply with this Policy, it will be deemed non responsive unless City is able to secure a waiver on Contractor's behalf. Refer to Attachment 1, City's Proposed Agreement Terms for additional details related to the application of this Policy to a contract awarded pursuant to this Solicitation.

In accordance with San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6, Sec. 6.4, Contractor shall use to the maximum extent possible, **recycled content materials**, rather than virgin materials.

All contractors and subcontractors who bid or work on a public works project must register and pay an annual fee to the California Department of Industrial Relations ("DIR"). No contractor or subcontractor may be listed in a bid for a public works project unless registered with the DIR as required by Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)]. No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work on a public works project unless registered with the DIR pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5.

This Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement of prevailing wage requirements by the California Department of Industrial Relations and/or the San Francisco Office of Labor Standards Enforcement.

Minimum wage rates for this project must comply with the current General Prevailing Wage as determined by the State Department of Industrial Relations. Minimum wage rates other than applicable to General Prevailing Wage must comply with San Francisco Administrative Code, Chapter 12P, Minimum Compensation Ordinance.

Pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 6.25, "Clean Construction is required for the performance of all work unless a waiver of all or part of the requirements of that Chapter has been granted under Sections 25.5 or 25.7."

This Contract is subject to the requirements of Administrative Code Chapter 12X, which prohibits the City from entering into any Contract with a Contractor that has its United States headquarters in a state ("Covered State") that has enacted discriminatory LGBT, restrictive abortion, or voter suppression laws, or all of the work on the contract will be performed in any of those states. The Port seeks to promote diversity within its contracting opportunities. We desire to engage contracting teams that reflect the diversity of our City and include participation of both businesses and residents from the City's most disadvantaged communities including, but not limited to, the neighborhoods in the 94107, 94124, and 94134 zip codes. As such, the City recommends that bidders consider the composition of their teams in terms of gender, age, ethnicity, and race, and to utilize teams that include a diverse mix of staff at all organizational levels.

The Port reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive any minor irregularities in any bid.
