


Little Embarcadero Gateway Activation Project | May 1, 2024 FWAC









The SF Port, the Fisherman's Wharf Community Benefit District, and Street Plans are collaborating on a near-term public space project that will offer new draws for visitors and locals and build on Fisherman's Wharf's unique features and history.




The project is designed to **complement** other efforts to advance economic recovery and address challenges like unpermitted vending and vacancies.



- Create alternatives to un-permitted vending
- Provide more free activities for kids and families
- Move visitors west from Pier 39
- Build on assets: waterfront views, historic structures, existing business offerings, and new amenities like the SkyStar Wheel
- Maintain permitted street performer relationships
- BE ACTION-ORIENTED! Focus on "near-term" interventions start this summer and iterate

Iterative Project Development Process

- Refining concept based on Port, City and stakeholder feedback
- Still defining materials/design approach for materials, Promenade design and playful elements
- Design forthcoming for signage (wayfinding) and Asphalt Art ground treatments
- Phased install and temporary materials will allow for ongoing iteration Management plan assumes we'll be making adjustments based on project performance to continue fine-tuning and adding

Phased implementation beginning mid-June















Management Approach

FWCBD to lead daily operations/management

- Nimble/flexible approach
- Daily ambassador and manager coverage
- Management of container pop-ups: FWCBD issues sub-agreements with kiosk vendors and manages call for interest; Port reviews and approves
- Anticipated pop-ups include: coffee; limited pre-prepared food and drink; family activities (ex: bike rental); unique retail with Fisherman's Wharf branding




CONCEPT OVERVIEW [SITE PLAN] Phase 1: Initial Elements Beginning Mid-June



SURFACE LEVEL: GROUND MURAL [CONCEPT DIAGRAM]













- Harness the "love lock" momentum create a program
- Develop designated sites where locks are invited
- Develop a signature lock that can be sold from a mobile cart and at participating local shops, as desired
- Establish a plan for removal of locks at designated intervals to protect infrastructure - integrate the locks into a larger collective art piece at the waterfront in the future
- Promote lock program for Valentines Day, engagement shoots, etc.




Love Locks Program Elements

Special lock sold from mobile cart and at local business sites **Approach 1:** Use panels to spell a word, panels can be removed **Approach 2:** Robust blue wires attached in the shape of waves with blue locks.





Collect locks, melt them down, and make an art piece!



- Refine concept design based on Port, City and stakeholder feedback
- Refine phased implementation process
- Develop draft operations plan
- May 14 Present to Port Commission
- Complete permitting and procurement
- Begin rolling out initial elements (mid June)
