

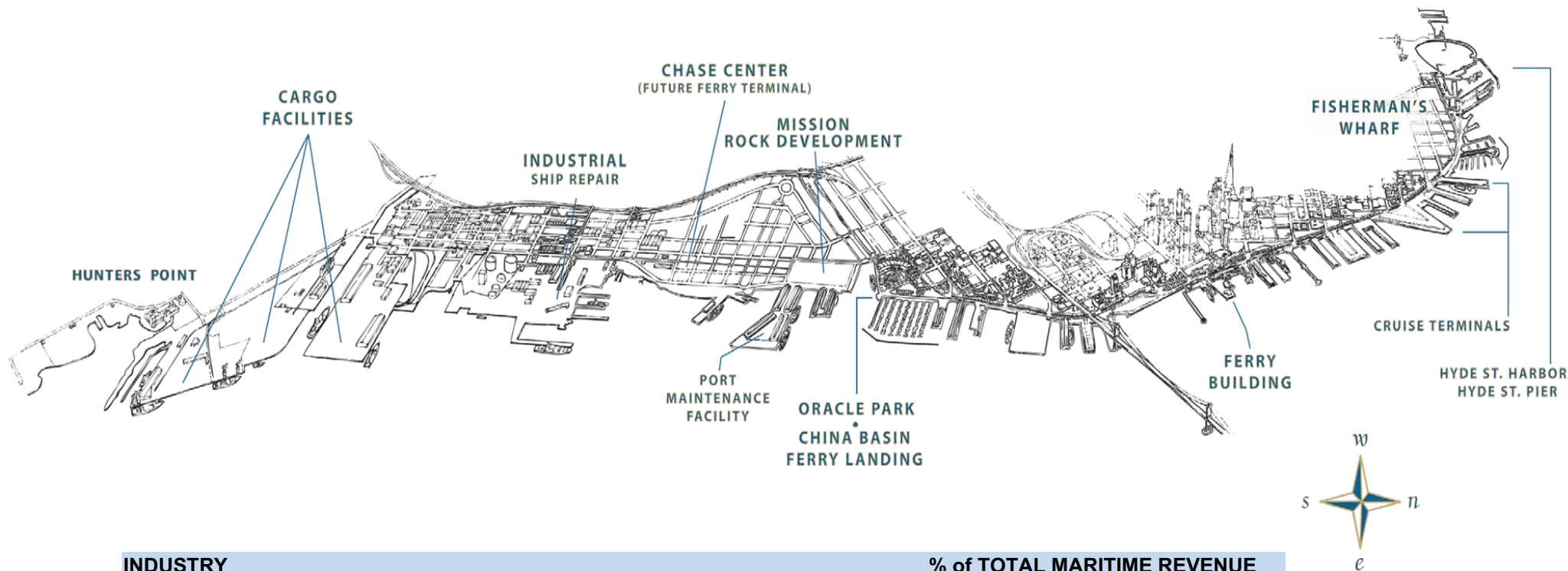

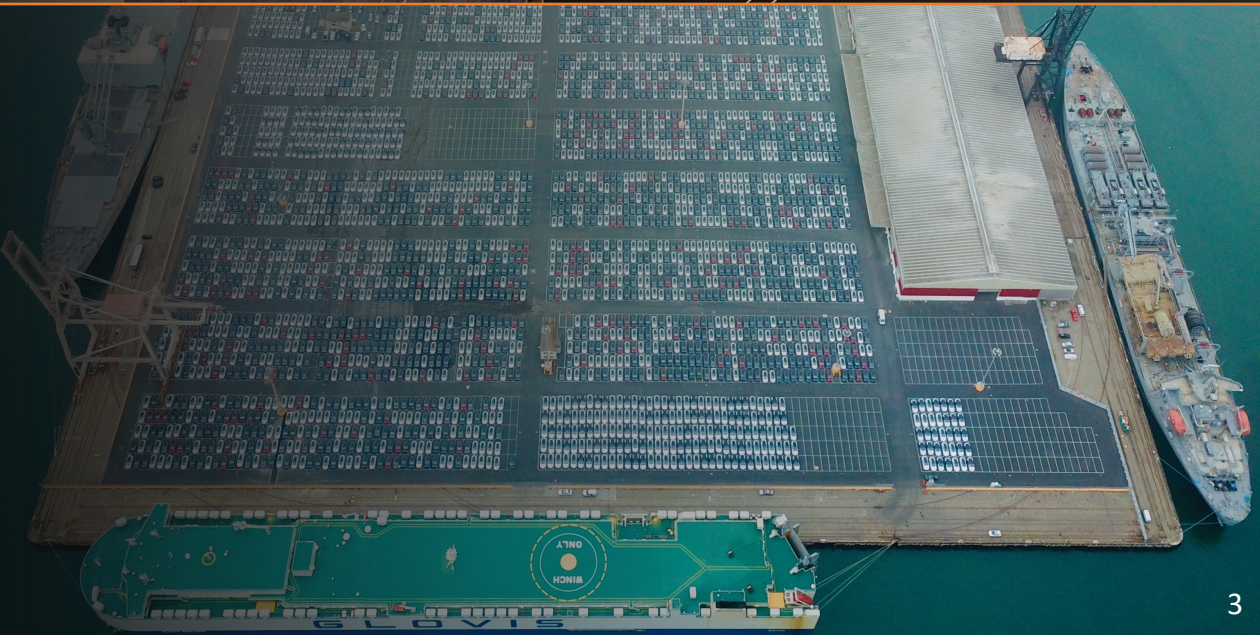




# Port's Maritime Industry
