



LiB Training and Exercise Debrief

Objective

Identify authorities, plans, courses of action for the three phases of Fire and Salvage Operations;

- Life Safety
- Incident Stabilization
- Salvage Actions
- Provide maritime fire suppression awareness training for multiple organizations.
- Provide Hazardous Materials response training for Lithium-ion battery fires.

Approach

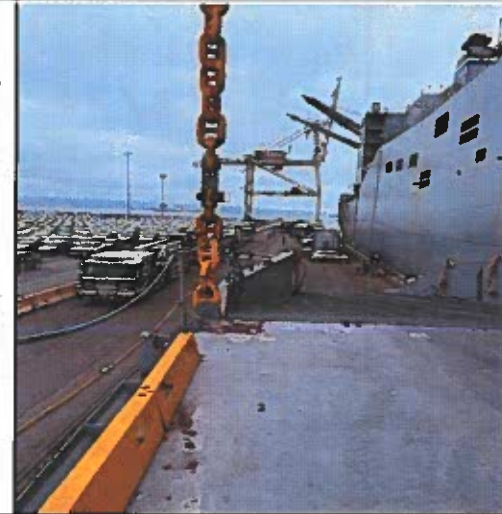
Conduct training that progressed from task to tactics and strategy:

- Pre-planning meetings with EPA, MARAD, PASHA
- Day 1 and 2 MARAD RO-CON walk-through with C/M and 3rd Mate
- Day 3 AM LiB Training/PM Tabletop exercise
- Day 4 Oakland fire “cancelled due to department emergency”

Outcomes

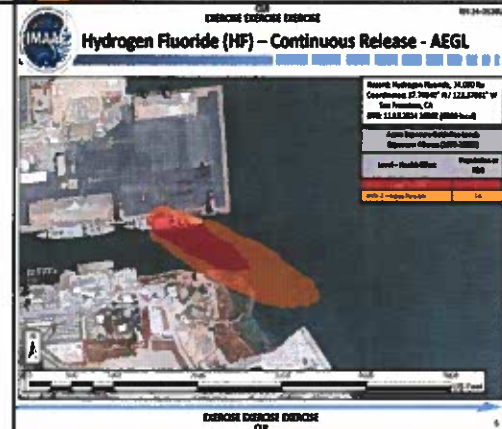
During three days of training the Port and EPA provided maritime fire suppression awareness training for more than 100 firefighters.

- Provided Lithium-ion battery basics and fire management training to more than 100 people.



Deltas

- Robust morning participation on day 3 (training and TTX) did not continue in the afternoon for the TTX
- The TTX did not meet any of the objectives or complete the exercise scenario

Path Forward

- The training and TTX have been excepted by EPA as the standardized model to be repeated at Port in the US
- The next delivery is scheduled for the Port of Long Beach sometime in August
- After the Long Beach the delivery the series can return to the Bay before moving to the next Port
- EPA is working with its Regional Congressional Liaisons to amplify and chart the course for California

Requirements

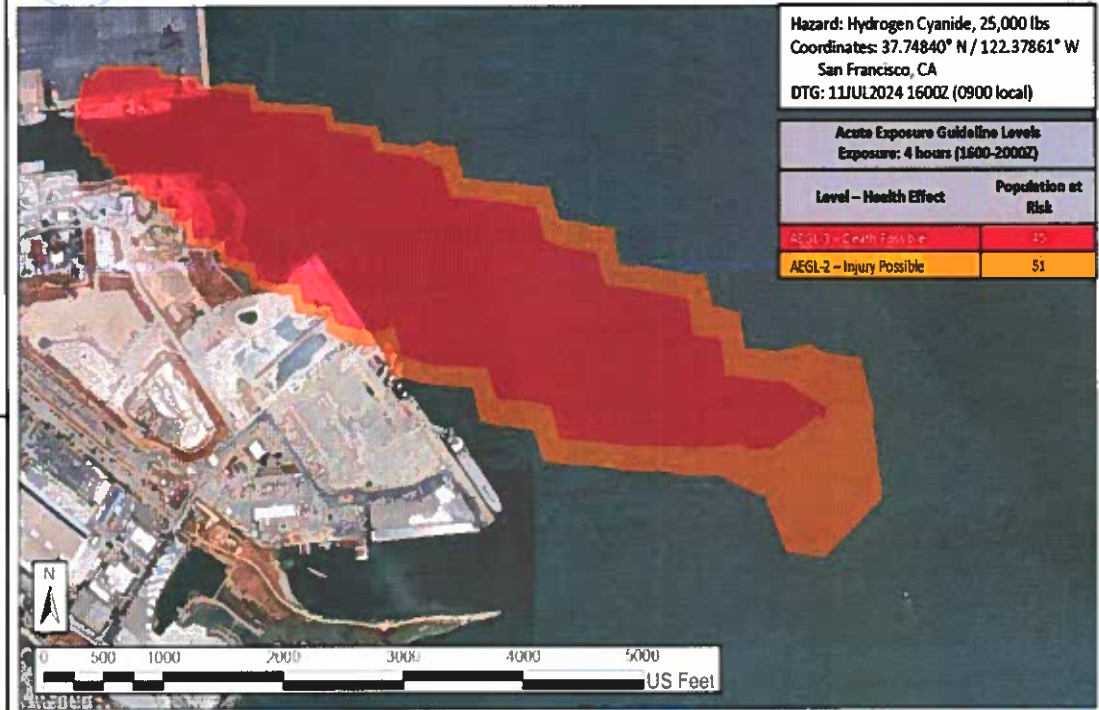
When the series returns to the Bay participation by local government in the Tabletop exercise is the only way the series objectives will be reached.
