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







Strategic Plan

- Cargo Maximize cargo opportunities at the deep-water cargo terminals.
- Cruise Evaluate facilities to support the Port's expanding cruise business.
- Pier 68 Shipyard Identify maritime opportunities for revitalizing select parcels at the Shipyard.
- Piers 80-96 and Backlands Pursue Federal and State grants to investigate site improvements to increase leasing ability by 2025.
- Commercial Fishing Industry Preserve and enhance commercial fishing at Fisherman's Wharf and Hyde Street Harbor.
- Water Transportation Expand the Port's water transit system and promotion of water transit.

• FY24 The Port of San Francisco hosted 94 Cruise Calls


Cruise

- FY24 363,000 passengers transited the Port of San Francisco's cruise terminals
 - FY24 generated approximately \$6.9M in passenger revenue
 - Port staff and the Port's cruise terminal operator, Metro Cruise, successfully held cruise operations at four different Port Facilities

Near-Term Cruise Objectives

- Continue analysis of a viable second electrified cruise berth in the Southern Waterfront
- Implement capital improvements at the Pier 27 James R. Herman Cruise Terminal
- Continue to identify and implement operational efficiencies at Piers 35, 27, and 30-32













Pier 80 Cruise Operations


Crown Princess

 - 4,050 Passengers Total
 - 1,551 Disembarked
 - 648 Transiting
 - 1,851 Embarked
- Facility Advantages
 - Ample Passenger Pick-up/Drop-Off Space
 - Direct Connections to I-80 & US101
 - Served by Muni T-Third Streetcar Line
 - Proximity to SFO
 - Supplemental shuttle service to Pier 39

Cargo Statistics 2024 (Tons)

Cargo

- Pier 80: Volume increase of 2.3% from the previous year
- FY24 Revenues increased due to interim activations at Pier 80
- Pier 92-94: Volume decrease of 34% from the previous year



Near-Term Cargo Objectives

• Pier 80

- Market the facility for other cargo opportunities
- Capital Improvements
 - Install new fender system Active
 - Repair subsidence and draining systems
- Activate select parcels at the facility with other maritime uses

• Pier 92

 Negotiate a new long-term lease with dry-bulk operator Martin-Marietta – Active





Pier 68 Shipyard Near-Term Objectives and Interim Uses

Objectives

- Sale and or Disposal of the drydocks
- Create leasing opportunities that attract light maritime industrial uses
- Promote interim and long-term berthing
- Grow interim leasing revenues within 10% of the previous three-year average
- Interim Uses
 - Lay-berthing
 - Fueling site of the zero-emission ferry Sea-Change
 - Short-term lease with Silverado Marine Contractors
 - Short-term lease with Royal Automotive Services
 - SFPUC MOU Power Offtake Agreement





Fisherman's Wharf / Hyde St. Harbor Near-Term Objectives

Capital Improvements

- Procurement of a new ice machine Active
- Reactivation of the fuel dock
- Reactivation of Wharf J-9 Active
- Dredging Active

Other Areas of Focus

- Improve essential harbor infrastructure and amenities
- Explore the feasibility of a marina management software program
- Improve harbor safety and security





Excursion / Water Transit Near-Term Objectives

- Restore public landing locations that were damaged by the 2023 winter storms
- Improve signage at Port operated landing locations for both water taxi and excursion operators
- Collaborate with water taxi operators to further promote along the water transit
- Ongoing engagement with WETA to expand ferry service to the Southern Waterfront
