9-1-1

(Available 24/7)

- Is there a danger to life, property, or the environment?
- Is there a crime in progress?
- Is someone having a medical emergency and needs immediate assistance?
- Is there a fire?
- If you answered YES to any of these questions, immediately call 9-1-1.



- **3-1-1** (Available 24/7)
- Are you concerned about an unsheltered individual? (request SFHOT)
- Have you seen a new encampment appear? (request SFHOT)
- Is this a non-emergency situation, but you're unsure how to report it?
- Is there needle litter that needs to be picked up?
- **Call or use the 311 app.** If you are concerned about an individual, calling is easier.



The January count of unsheltered people in the Outreach Zone found **79 people**

- Most people were observed along Market Street, along New Montgomery Street, along I-80, and near South Park
- **15** people were observed in the Safety Zone
 - 8 were near the Ferry Building

Homelessness is highly dynamic and variable. We will continue to conduct homeless counts in the outreach zone and will be tracking trends overtime.



*Each of the last three PIT counts used a different methodology. Moving forward, the methodology used for the January count will be standard practice.




