DUMPSTERS & TRASH

- Keep dumpster lids closed to keep out rainwater.
- Have **spill cleanup materials** handy near the dumpster and loading dock areas.
- Never place liquid waste or leaky garbage bags into a dumpster.
- Don't hose out dumpster interior in areas that drain to the storm drain system. Apply absorbent if any fluids are spilled in the dumpster.

STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION

Best Management Practices for Restaurants



A practical guide for restaurants to comply with stormwater regulations and protect the San Francisco Bay waters and wildlife from harmful runoff.



Did you know that it is illegal to discharge anything but stormwater into stormwater drains in San Francisco?

Many stormwater inlets at the Port of San Francisco drain directly into the Bay. Due to the amount of fats, oils, grease, and cleaning chemicals that they handle, restaurants play a critical role in keeping our water safe and clean. Follow these best management practices (BMPs) to ensure that you are complying with all Port, San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, and California Water Board stormwater regulations on restaurants.

TRAINING

 Train all employees upon hiring – and annually thereafter – on personal safety, management of fats, oils, and grease (FOG), and proper methods for handling and disposing of waste.

CLEANING

 Clean equipment in a designated indoor area, such as a mop sink. Ex: floor mats, grease traps, grills, and garbage cans.



- Sweep, mop or vacuum instead of using a hose to clean outdoor areas.
- Dry sweep pavement areas frequently. If you must use water for cleaning, use a mop and bucket and **dispose of wash water in a mop sink.**
- **Do not clean equipment outdoors** in any area where water may flow to a street, gutter, storm drain, or the Bay.
- Never pour wash water, grease or oil outside or into a street, gutter or storm drain.

SPILLS

• Use granular absorbents (e.g. cat litter) to absorb the spill. Dry sweep and dispose of used absorbent in the garbage.



- If wet cleaning is required, dry clean first and then mop and collect water. Dispose of water in sink or other indoor drain, not the storm drain.
- Do not clean up spills by hosing down washwater into the gutter or a storm drain.
